Cookies should make the website work better, not obscure how information is handled

01 Website operation

Cookies can support page loading, security, forms, preferences and session continuity.

02 Analytics

APIS may use aggregated website statistics to understand use and improve content.

03 Transparency

Where online tracking collects personal information, APIS should explain the collection clearly.

04 Choice

Users can control cookies through browser settings and, where available, website controls.

05 Third parties

Third-party analytics or tracking tools require due diligence, data minimisation and review.

06 Related policies

This notice should be read with APIS's Privacy Statement, Terms of Use and Our Policies.

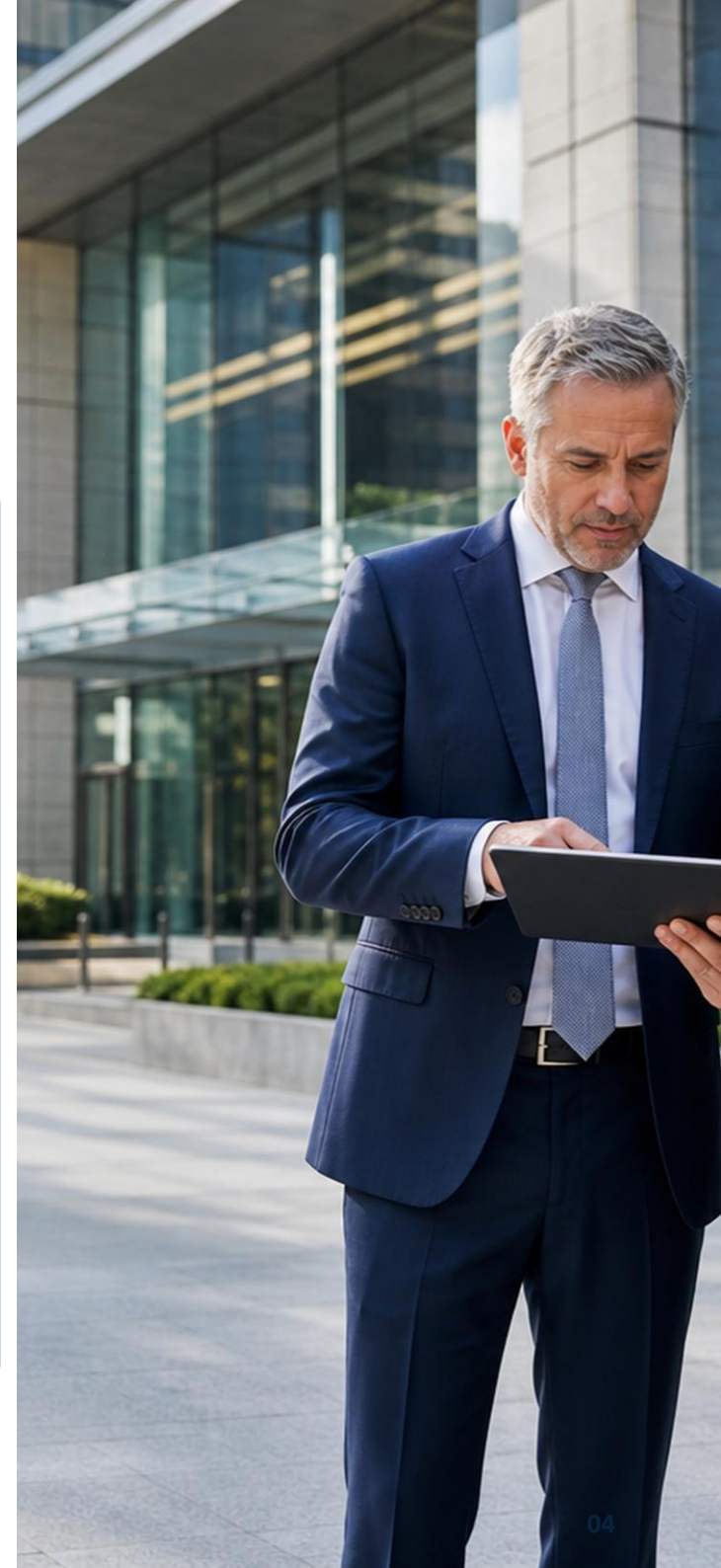
Scope of this notice

This Use of Cookies notice explains how APIS may use cookies, website analytics, pixels, tags, scripts, local storage and similar technologies on the APIS website and related digital channels.

It applies to visitors who browse APIS website pages, download APIS materials, submit online enquiries, interact with embedded content or use any website feature that relies on browser-based technologies.

This notice should be read with APIS's Privacy Statement, Terms of Use and Our Policies. If a service agreement, contractor portal notice, privacy collection notice or client-specific arrangement applies, that more specific document may also govern the relevant interaction.

Australian privacy obligations may apply where online identifiers or browsing information identify, or reasonably identify, an individual.





COOKIE NOTICE 2

What cookies are

Cookies are small text files or data records that a website may place on a user's browser or device. They can help a website recognise a browser, remember choices, maintain a session, support security checks, measure performance or understand how content is used.

Similar technologies may include tracking pixels, software tags, scripts, local storage, device identifiers, embedded media tools and analytics events.

Cookies may be session based or persistent. Session cookies usually expire when the browser closes. Persistent cookies remain for a set period or until the user deletes them through browser settings.

Cookies may be first-party cookies set by APIS or its website platform, or third-party cookies set by service providers that support analytics, security, embedded content, maps, media or advertising tools.

Why APIS may use cookies

APIS may use cookies and similar technologies to operate its website, protect digital channels, understand website performance, improve content, manage enquiry forms, remember user preferences and support service, investor, contractor and stakeholder communications.

APIS aims to use cookies in a way that is proportionate to the website function being supported.

APIS does not intend to use cookies to collect sensitive information. If APIS considers using technology that could collect sensitive information, APIS should assess whether express consent, configuration limits or an alternative approach is required.

APIS should configure analytics and tracking technologies to minimise personal information collection where reasonably practicable.

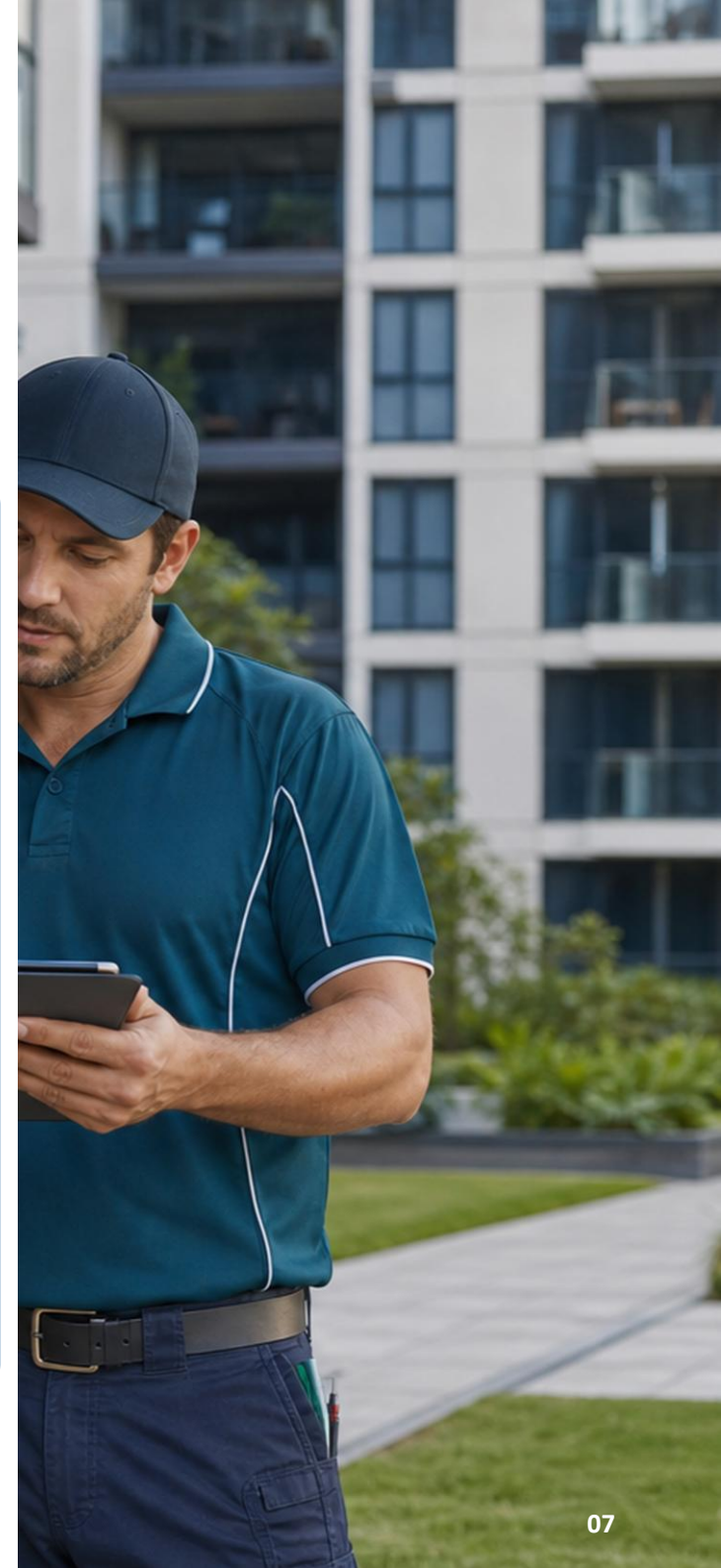
Types of cookies APIS may use

Strictly necessary cookies may be used to load pages, maintain site security, support form submission, remember privacy choices, prevent misuse and enable core website functions.

Functional cookies may remember preferences such as display choices, form progress, user settings or other features that make the website easier to use.

Performance and analytics cookies may help APIS understand page visits, traffic sources, content engagement, device and browser types, error reports, downloads and general usage trends.

Marketing or third-party tracking cookies should only be used where APIS has assessed the tool, its purpose, its privacy implications and any required notice, consent or opt-out mechanism.





COOKIE NOTICE 5

Website analytics and improvement

APIS may use website analytics to understand how visitors use its website, which pages are accessed, what content is useful, how visitors arrive at the site and whether pages or forms need improvement.

Analytics may involve information such as IP address, browser type, device information, pages viewed, date and time of access, referring website and interaction events.

Where possible, APIS should use aggregated or de-identified analytics reporting. APIS should not use analytics results to identify individual visitors unless this is reasonably necessary for security, troubleshooting, misuse investigation or another lawful business purpose.

Analytics tools and retention settings should be reviewed periodically.

Third-party tools and tracking pixels

APIS may use third-party service providers to support website hosting, security, analytics, maps, embedded media, form handling, customer relationship management, advertising measurement or campaign performance.

Some third-party tools may set cookies or use pixels, scripts, tags or similar technologies that collect online activity information.

Before APIS deploys third-party tracking pixels or advertising tools, APIS should understand what information is collected, whether it may be personal information, whether it may be sent overseas, how the provider uses it and whether the tool can be configured to reduce collection.

APIS should avoid using tracking tools in a way that covertly collects personal information or discloses sensitive information.



Managing cookie choices

Users can usually manage cookies through their browser settings. Browser controls may allow users to block cookies, delete existing cookies, receive alerts before cookies are stored or limit third-party tracking.

If a user disables cookies, some APIS website pages, forms, security features, embedded tools or preference settings may not operate correctly.

Where APIS provides a cookie banner, preference centre, consent tool or unsubscribe mechanism, users should use those controls to manage available choices.

Users may also be able to manage advertising preferences through third-party platforms, browser privacy settings, device settings or industry opt-out tools made available by relevant providers.



Data protection, records and updates

APIS should manage cookie and website analytics information consistently with its Privacy Statement, information security practices, contractual obligations and applicable Australian privacy requirements.

Access to analytics or tracking dashboards should be limited to authorised users who need the information for legitimate APIS business purposes.

APIS should keep a practical record of key website technologies, including the provider, purpose, data collected, retention settings, overseas disclosures if known and any user choice mechanism.

This notice should be updated when APIS materially changes its website tracking tools, analytics providers, marketing tools or privacy practices.

Cookie questions and review

This notice should be reviewed whenever APIS changes its website platform, analytics tools, embedded media, advertising pixels, contractor portals, online forms, customer relationship systems or other online tracking technologies.
